

## DEFINITIONS

### **GENDER EXPRESSION:**

The manner in which a person represents or expresses gender to others, often through behavior, clothing, hairstyles, voice, or mannerisms.

### **GENDER IDENTITY:**

A person's deeply held internal sense of their own gender, regardless of the sex they were assigned at birth.

### **GENDER-NONCONFORMING:**

An umbrella term for people whose gender expression differs from stereotypical expectations of the sex they were assigned at birth.

### **TRANSGENDER:**

An umbrella term describing a person whose gender identity or expression is different from that traditionally associated with their assigned sex at birth.

### **GENDER PRONOUNS:**

The pronouns with which we refer to someone in conversation (i.e. he/him/his, they/them/their/ she/her/hers). Please note that some people may also go by their names as opposed to pronouns.

### **TRANSITION:**

The process in which a person goes from living and identifying as one gender to living and identifying as another. Transitions are not linear and may include any combination of physical, social, and medical processes.

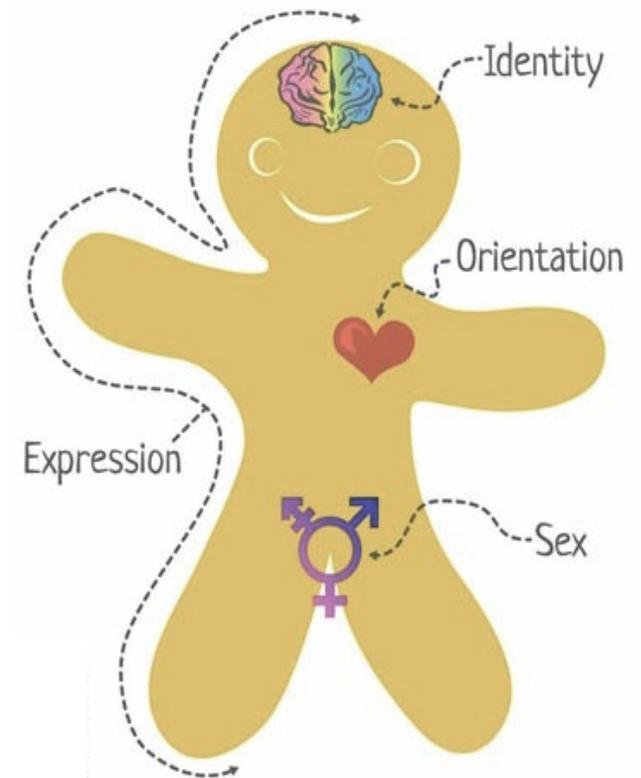

## KEY POINTS FOR SCHOOL STAFF

### KEEP IN MIND:

- Students have the right to be called by their preferred name and gender pronoun.
- A student's transition may be "site-specific" (they choose to go by one name or pronoun in one place and different name or pronoun used in another).
- If a student prefers to go by a different name and has expressed a readiness to share this information, the school's registrar should enter that name in the "Preferred First Name" field of the STARS/Aspen database.
- Arbitrary gender dividers should be eliminated wherever they can be avoided (Ex: students line up by last name vs. boy/girl or same graduation gown color for all students).
- Students are entitled to use the bathroom or locker room that matches their gender identity.
- If there is a privacy concern, *any* student has the right to access a reasonable accommodation (i.e. a single user restroom, a separate changing schedule).

## KEY POINTS FOR FAMILIES

### THE MOST IMPORTANT THING FAMILY MEMBERS CAN PROVIDE IS SUPPORT.
