The mother, stated, she does not want her children attending to the children being victims of countless bullying either in the school or at home with However, when asked by school officials to present documentation of those encounters either a police report or times she informed the school she failed to do so. Also, after addressing and explaining to her that the school does not have enough documentation in our system to warrants a safety transfer for either and recommend that she allows both to come back to school therefore they wouldn't fall behind in their perspectives classes. That she allows where he was the victim or aggressor in the school years. OB, has been involved in a total of four incidents where she was the aggressor in physical altercations dating back to the school year. Multiple mediations have been held with OB in response to peer conflict.
In response, DCPS took the following measures:

- to explain the reasons why the school cannot grant a safety 1 met with
- will meet with OB to explain the procedure if she is encountering any form of bullying, verbally/physically when she returns to school.
- will attempt to reach out with parents of the students to conduct an intervention for all parties and addressing the zero tolerance contract if need be.

DCPS conducted an investigation which included speaking with you and your child. Based on the findings and lack of documentation that was presented the reported actions do not constitute a violation of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations.

DCPS does not tolerate the mistreatment of students in any form to include bullying, sexual harassment, or other forms of discrimination. Nor does DCPS tolerate retaliation for reporting behavior that could constitute mistreatment and such behavior should be reported immediately.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of this investigation, you have the right to file an appeal within 10 calendar days of receipt of this letter. Appeals must be submitted in writing. Appeal requests may be submitted via U.S. Postal Mail to 1200 First St., 9th Floor; Attn: Resolution Grievance Division or via email at dcps.grievance@dc.gov. You may also contact the U.S. Department of Education, Office on Civil Rights (1-800-421-3481) to report any educational discrimination on the basis of race, sex, disability, etc.
