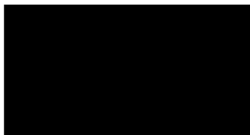







RE: Reported Incident


Dear 

This letter is in reference to concerns that were brought to my attention on February 6, 2017, regarding your daughter, . Specifically, there were allegations of bullying by another student in her  classroom.

In response,  staff and I took the following measures:

1. School has separated  and accused student whenever possible and closely monitor both during recess/lunch and transitions (i.e. to specials classes).
2. Continue to use our support staff (Social Workers, Behavior Technician, Psychologist) to help the students of the  classroom improve their abilities to interact positively and resolve conflict peacefully.
4.  meets with the social worker at least 3 times per month and her safety point of contact is our Behavior Technician,  who can meet with her any day on an as-needed basis.

I conducted an investigation which included speaking with you, your *child*, and other students/person identified as witnesses and/or deemed relevant. Based on the findings of the investigation, the reported actions do not constitute a violation of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations.

At  we do not tolerate the mistreatment of students in any way including bullying, sexual harassment, or other forms of discrimination. Nor do we tolerate retaliation for reporting behavior that could constitute mistreatment and such behavior should be reported immediately.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of this investigation, you have the right to file an appeal within 10 calendar days of receipt of this letter. Appeals must be submitted in writing. Appeal requests may be submitted via U.S. Postal Mail to 1200 First St., 9th Floor; Attn: Resolution Grievance Division or via email at dcps.grievance@dc.gov. You may also contact the U.S. Department of Education, Office on Civil Rights (1-800-421-3481) to report any educational discrimination on the basis of race, sex, disability, etc.
