This letter is in reference to concerns that were brought to the attention of DCPS on February 3rd, 2017 regarding your Student, [REDACTED] specifically, *bullying allegations and safety at school.*

In response, DCPS took the following measures:

1. [REDACTED] and the student involved in the altercation on [REDACTED] have been assigned different homerooms as to that the ensure students do not interact with each other. They have also been assigned different class schedules.
2. Our school nurse, [REDACTED] has made several attempts via email/phone call/in-person on [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] to obtain consent to speak with [REDACTED] doctor in order to gain specific information that would be used to develop a transition plan back into a full school day. Parental consent outstanding.
3. A meeting to address your concerns, and developed a safety plan for [REDACTED] was held on [REDACTED] with you, your attorney, [REDACTED] and relevant [REDACTED] Staff including administration: Assistant Principal [REDACTED] Principal [REDACTED] and School Social Worker [REDACTED]
4. Annual 504 meeting to be held on [REDACTED]

DCPS conducted an investigation which included speaking with you, your *child*, and other students/person identified as witnesses and/or deemed relevant. Based on the findings of the investigation, the reported actions do not constitute a violation of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations.

DCPS does not tolerate the mistreatment of students in any form to include bullying, sexual harassment, or other forms of discrimination. Nor does DCPS tolerate retaliation for reporting behavior that could constitute mistreatment and such behavior should be reported immediately.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of this investigation, you have the right to file an appeal within 10 calendar days of receipt of this letter. Appeals must be submitted in writing. Appeal requests may be submitted via U.S. Postal Mail to 1200 First St., 9th Floor; Attn: Resolution Grievance Division or via email at dcps.grievance@dc.gov. You may also contact the U.S. Department of Education, Office on Civil Rights (1-800-421-3481) to report any educational discrimination on the basis of race, sex, disability, etc.
