This letter is in reference to concerns that were brought to the attention of DCPS on June 6, 2017 regarding your, Specifically:

- Not being notified of your student's progress during 4th quarter for his PE grade
- Grade only being calculated on one skill of dribbling in PE

In response, DCPS conducted an investigation which included speaking with you, and other persons identified as witnesses and/or deemed relevant. Based on that investigation, DCPS found the following:

- · Your student's Health & Physical Education grade was calculated using 6 categories:
 - 1. Determine Level of Physical Fitness and Use Strategies to Improve Health in an Active Lifestyle
 - 2. Demonstrate Several Motor Skills and Movement Patterns Necessary for a Variety of Physical Activities
 - 3. Apply Mental and Social Strategies, Ideas, and Principals to Learn and Perform Physical Activity
 - 4. Know How to Promote Health and Prevent Diseases
 - 5. Know How to Choose High Quality, Health Information, Products, and Services
 - 6. Show Skills in Making Decisions and Setting Goals that will Enhance Health
- Your student received secure markings (S) across all 4 terms in the category of
 in which the unit on

Striking Skills (dribbling) was included.

In order to address these issues, DCPS implemented the following measures:

- Meeting was held with you, Principal and Assistant Principal on July 5, 2017 to address your concerns and to establish a communication plan for the 2017-18 SY.
- Principal has been identified as your Point of Contact for the 2017-18 SY to ensure there is effective communication between you and
- 3. Your student's third term grade has been changed from a 2 to a 3 as of July 18, 2017.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of this investigation, you have the right to file an appeal within 10 calendar days of receipt of this letter. The appeal must be submitted in writing.
