This letter is in reference to concerns that were brought to the attention of DCPS on December 20, 2017 regarding your client [REDACTED]. Specifically, [REDACTED] was taking classes through [REDACTED] only and student not receiving 504 services and accommodations

In response, DCPS conducted an investigation which included speaking with you and other persons deemed relevant. Based on that investigation, DCPS found the following:
