RE: Reported Incident: General Grievance
Dear
This letter is in reference to concerns that were brought to the attention of DCPS on January 30, 2018 regarding your child, specifically, allegations that your student was involved in an altercation in which your student's jacket went missing and the lack of communication from administration in regards to the incident and jacket.
In response, DCPS conducted an investigation that included speaking with you, your child, and other persons/students deemed relevant. Based on that investigation, DCPS found the following:  On January 29 <sup>th</sup> , I spoke with his classmates and staff regarding coat. It was reported that took his classmates coat and put it in the toilet. Late that afternoon, coat was taken and placed in a toilet was sent to retrieve his coat missing until it was time for him to depart for the day. Staff reported was sent to retrieve his coat from the bathroom. However, did not return to the original staff member to inform her the bathroom was locked. Staff was unaware went home without a coat.  On January 29 <sup>th</sup> , a member of the custodial staff informed that the coat was retrieved from the toilet and discarded.  On January 29 <sup>th</sup> at approximately 3:13 pm, informed you the coat was discarded and you were offered a new coat
<ol> <li>In order to address these issues, DCPS implemented the following measures:</li> <li>On February 2<sup>nd</sup>, a new coat was given to</li> <li>A meeting was held on February 6<sup>th</sup> with you, Principal concerns.</li> <li>will be your point of contact for when incidents occur for the remainder of the 17-18 SY.</li> </ol>
If you are not satisfied with the outcome of this investigation, you have the right to file an appeal within 10 calendar days of receipt of this letter. The appeal must be submitted in writing. Appeal requests may be submitted via U.S. Postal Mail to 1200 First St., 9 <sup>th</sup> Floor; Attn: Resolution Grievance Division or via email at dcps.grievance@dc.gov. You may also contact the U.S. Department of Education, Office on Civil Rights (1-800-421-3481) to report any educational discrimination on the basis of race, sex, disability, etc.
