

- Over the past five years, DCPS has taken steps to ensure that all students meet our standard of excellence and have the support they need to thrive.
- We are proud of the 2,062 4-year graduates (72.5%) who met our standards of excellence, and we will continue to provide support to all students on the path to graduation.
- Building strong systems and structures is a multi-year process, and we will continue
 this work to support future DCPS graduates as they transition into college and their
 future careers.

The 4-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate (ACGR) measures the percent of 9th graders who graduate within four years.

ACGR is calculated by following a cohort of rising 9th grade students to determine the percentage that receive a **regular diploma within 4 years** (including students who graduate early).

Grads within 4 years


(Grads within 4 years + non-grads*) – (Transfer students who produce valid documentation)

*Non-grads include:

- •Students who withdraw without subsequent enrollment (Any student who transfers and produces valid documentation of enrollment in another degree-granting school will be removed from the cohort).
- •Students who are still enrolled and did not graduate in 4 years.
- Students who receive all other types of diploma/certificate other than a traditional diploma (e.g., GED, SPED certificates).


The 2022 4-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rate is 72.5% increased by 1.9 percentage points from 70.6% in 2021.

DCPS 4-Year Adjusted Cohort Graduation Rates





The graduation rate was higher in 2022 compared to 2021 for 8 out of 20 high schools (40%).




The majority of students in the 2022 ACGR cohort were students of color.

Racial Composition of 2022 ACGR Cohort




Racial Composition of 2022 ACGR Graduates




Since 2020, the graduation rate has increased for most subgroups. However, it has declined for Hispanic students and English Learners since last year.

4-Year ACGR Trends 2020-2022, Districtwide Subgroups






The 5-Year ACGR has declined in all Opportunity Academies.




In SY21-22, secondary completion rates have declined for all three Opportunity Academies.





Note. Secondary completion rate is the number of students who complete school with a credential – regular HS diploma, NEDP certificate, IEP certificate, of GED – divided by the number of students expected to receive a credential in their terminal year of secondary school. This metric rewards alternative schools serving students far removed from their FNGY to be captured in the 4-year or 5-year ACGR.






Graduate College & Career Readiness


Among 2022 ACGR cohort graduates who took the SAT, 43.4% and 27% met the College and Career Ready benchmark in EBRW and math, respectively.

Note. Nationally, **65%** of the Class of 2022 students met the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing benchmark (480+) and **45%** met the Math benchmark (530+) based on a student's most recent SAT results (https://reports.collegeboard.org/media/pdf/2022-total-group-sat-suite-of-assessments-annual-report.pdf). The denominator represents the number of graduates who took the SAT.

Among 2022 ACGR cohort graduates who took an AP exam, 37.6% earned a passing score of 3 or higher.



Among the 781 non-graduates* in the 2022 cohort, 44.4% are currently registered in DCPS as of November 2022.


Percent of Non-Graduates by Registration Status as of EOY21-22 and Nov 2022

While most non-graduates are not currently enrolled, Opportunity Academies had the largest number of non-graduates re-enrolled.


Non-Graduates and Current Enrollment Status (as of Nov 2022)




■ Currently Enrolled in the Same School ■ Currently Enrolled in a Different School ■ Not Currently Enrolled

% of Non-Graduates Registered as of EOY21-22 AND Currently Registered as of Nov 2022




The majority of non-graduates who are currently registered are enrolled in Ballou STAY, Roosevelt STAY, and Luke C. Moore.



Ninth Grade Academies


ACGR for NGA students have increased to 69% in 2022. ACGR for NGA schools have remained flat at 71% since 2020.



Note. This graph reports adjusted cohort graduation rates (ACGR) for NGA schools and NGA students in 2017-2022. NGA students' graduation rates are calculated based on students who participated in NGA in SY13-14 to SY18-19 and were included in the 2017 to 2022 ACGR cohorts, respectively, regardless of their cohort responsible school.

The majority (84%) of NGA participants who were promoted ontime to 10th grade graduated on time. About 4% dropped out.


Outcomes of NGA Participants Promoted On-Time to 10th Grade (n=506)

The majority of NGA students who were promoted on time to 10th grade have graduated.



27% of NGA participants who were **not** promoted on time to 10th grade graduated; 27% dropped out. 43% were still enrolled as of EOY21-22.


Outcomes of NGA Participants NOT Promoted On-Time to 10th Grade (n=182)
