Grades Served at Opening	9 th grade Possible small 10 th grade, based on enrollment interest		
Boundary and Feeder Pattern	 In-boundary, neighborhood school for all students living in the Hardy MS boundary. New destination school for all students attending Hardy MS, Eaton ES, Hyde-Addisor ES, Key ES, Mann ES, Stoddert ES. 		
Phase-In Policy for Current Hardy Students	 Current (SY21-22) 6th and 7th graders have dual feeder rights to both MacArthur HS and Jackson-Reed HS. Any Hardy student entering 9th grade in School Year 2025-2026 or later will have feeder rights only to MacArthur HS, unless the student has a sibling enrolled at Jackson-Reed at the time of their entry to high school. 		
Phase-in Policy for Students at Feeder ES	 Current (SY21-22) PK4-5th graders will only have feeder rights to MacArthur HS, unless the student has a sibling enrolled at Jackson-Reed at the time of their entry to high school.

FACILITIES UPDATE

When MacArthur HS opens in August 2023 the building will have the key elements required for a high school including a full-size high school gym, kitchen/cafeteria, classroom space, science labs, a high school sized soccer field, a media center, office space, and specialized spaces (like a black box performance space)




Phase I Delivery:

- Full sized high school Gym
- Kitchen/Cafeteria to be constructed
- Media Center
- Art Classrooms & Black Box Performance Space
- 15 General Education Spaces (including two science labs)
- Office Space for student pull-out and staff
- High School athletic field

- Phase I Prioritization Includes:
 - Security systems (access control, intrusion detection, etc) to district standards
 - Operational Systems: Public address system, clocks, WiFi, etc
 - Evaluation and any necessary work on HVAC systems
 - Standard classroom improvements (paint, flooring, appropriate furniture, etc)
 throughout existing building
 - Smartboard installation in classrooms targeted for SY '23-24 use

•Phase I also includes the renovation of the northwestern portion of the building into a kitchen/cafeteria





Phase I Delivery:

- Classroom spaces will not change for Phase I. Majority classrooms meet DCPS standard for secondary schools.
- Rooms will be outfitted for specific programming based on existing amenities.

Facilities Improvements: Phase II

After MacArthur HS opens, updates will be made to existing space to create at least 15 additional general education spaces. An addition to the building will include an auditorium and ancillary spaces, and an additional classroom bar tentatively focused on electives, science, and CTE.

- Updates to classrooms in existing building
- Additional 15+ general education spaces in existing building
- Building Addition
 - Location TBD
 - Auditorium & ancillary spaces
 - Additional classroom bar tentatively focusing on specials, science, and CTE

Traffic Study Update

- DCPS and DGS commissioned a traffic study to determine:
 - Where may the high school associated traffic cause strain?
 - What accommodations are recommended to alleviate this potential traffic strain?
- DCPS has begun working with WMATA and DDOT around public transit and other alternate commute methods
- •DCPS, DGS, Traffic Engineers, WMATA, and DDOT will all be present at a Meeting specifically to address Traffic MacArthur Blvd Traffic Concerns, to be held on Tuesday, 6/21/22 at 6:00pm

- Robust Inner Core Programs e.g. choir, dance, band, art, etc.
- Extracurricular activities and athletics based on student interest
- College and Career planning and opportunities
- School counseling support
