This letter is in reference to concerns that were brought to the attention of DCPS on August 22, 2018 regarding your student, Specifically, and other students marked tardy regardless of arriving to school before 8:45am.

In response, DCPS conducted an investigation which included speaking with you and other persons deemed relevant. Based on that investigation, DCPS has found the following:

arrived at school on time at 8:30am accompanied by his mother and was deemed late by the attendance coordinator because it was 8:48am when his parent finished turning in paperwork to the main office.

In order to address these issues, DCPS has implemented the following actions:

5. will send home a flyer stating arrival and dismissal procedures by week ending and also post the flyer on the school website. The flyer will give suggestions on how students can maximize their time in the morning to get through the security lines quickly and efficiently.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of this investigation, you have the right to file an appeal within 10 calendar days of receipt of this letter. The appeal must be submitted in writing.
