In accordance with Chapter 24, Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

We acknowledge that there has been a delay since the filing of this grievance. Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. **5-B DCMR Subtitle 2405.2 (c)** where it is alleged that any student or group of students is being subjected to an arbitrary or unreasonable regulation, procedure, or standard of conduct. You allege that your student, **1000**, was given peanut butter crackers by her teacher as a snack in the classroom. Student **1000** is allergic to peanuts.

General Findings of Fact

The following findings of fact resulted from the investigation:

- 1. Peanuts and tree nuts are not served in any DCPS provided meals (through food service vendors).
- 2. advertises, via the Family Handbook, that the school is a peanut and tree-nut free building.
- 3. Teaching staff are permitted to bring snacks to for students.
- 4. Students are permitted to bring snacks into
- 7. Teacher at records of student allergies.
- 8. Administrative Aide at a maintains a system by which she maintains records of student allergies for the aftercare program.
- 9. Aftercare staff are prohibited from providing snacks for students enrolled in the aftercare program.

Discussion/Conclusion

As a result of this review, DCPS has found the following:

1. DCPS is unable to substantiate **5-B DCMR Subtitle 2405.2 (c).** There is insufficient evidence to confirm or deny that **1**, Teacher at **1**,

While DCPS has not found any systemic violations of law, the following action by the due dates established below:

- 1. Post signage in the main office that announces that is a nut-free building by the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year.
- 2. Post signage on all classroom doors that announces that the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year.
- 3. Develop and implement a school-wide, classroom-based system that documents student allergies by the beginning of the 2020-2021 school year.
- 4. On a quarterly basis for SY 2020-2021, announce via memorandum from the Principal, to all staff that sector is a nut-free building.
 5. On a quarterly basis, announce via the school community that sector is a nut-free building.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
