In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its review of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

We acknowledge there has been a lapse in time since the filing of this grievance. Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. **5-B DCMR 2405.2(e)**: Where a student is a victim of bullying or harassment, including sexual harassment. It was reported to DCPS CARE that Student A instigated a fight with Student . on . Additionally, it was reported that Student A and Student engaged in several altercations and that Student A frequently made fun of Student

DCPS CARE attempted to contact you regarding any ongoing concerns but was unable to reach you. In the future, should you have any concerns regarding Student safety at the number below.
