
Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. **5-B DCMR 2405.2 (a)**: Where it is alleged that any student or group of students is being denied access to an adequate educational opportunity. You allege that your student is not receiving transportation.

Investigative Procedure

Discussion/Conclusion

As a result of this review, DCPS has found the following:

1. DCPS is unable to substantiate 5-B DCMR 2405.2 (a). However, the transportation route for has been updated and is in effect.

While DCPS has not found any systemic violations of law, DCPS CARE makes the following agency-wide recommendations:

 DCPS should review the guidance given to schools to ensure there are specific guidelines for when transportation amendments are entered into TOTE. Any updates should be made within 90 calendar days.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
