In accordance with Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.2(c) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issue under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. 5-B—2405.2(c) Where it is alleged that any student or group of students is being subjected to an arbitrary or unreasonable regulation, procedure or standard of conduct

It is alleged that on February 17, 2019 classroom teacher, was verbally abusive toward student on a school trip. It is alleged that teacher, used profanities, shared that the student, has an IEP and struggles academically, and threatened that she, the could send the home at any time.

Discussion/Conclusion

DCPS has taken or will take the following action as a result of these allegations:

- 1. A referral was sent to Labor Management and Employee Relations (LMER) on March 7, 2019, for the review and investigation of these allegations. Their findings and any disciplinary actions will remain confidential due to employee privacy guidelines.
- 2. The Principal, **1999**, and the Assistant Principal **1999**, met with **1999** on or around February 25, 2019 to assure her that they were there to help.
- 3. Training for on FERPA by November 1, 2019

If you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
