In accordance with Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, DC Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues:

Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.1(d), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, and national origin

You allege that your student was not selected as a member of the race.

Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.2(c), allegation that any student or group of students is being subjected to an arbitrary or unreasonable regulation, procedure, or standard of conduct

You allege that your student was improperly not selected as a member of the varsity baseball team based on a "pay to play" selections process.

Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.2(f), other violation

Discussion/Conclusion:
1. DCPS finds that Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.1(d) is not substantiated. DCPS conducted a review of the player evaluation and skill assessments for all students who tried out for the variety baseball team during SY and determined that

poorly, there was no evidence to support a claim of race-based discrimination. ¹

	DCPS investigated your allegation of a "pay to play" process; however, we did not find evidence of the suggested process. Specifically, we identified at least one player who participated in the financial contributions.
3.	DCPS is unable to substantiate Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.2(f). DCPS does not have jurisdiction over PTSOs, PTAs or booster organizations. However, our investigation confirmed that a graph organization in the District of Columbia.
