In accordance with Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its preliminary investigation of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

We acknowledge that there has been a lapse in time since the filing of this grievance. Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

5-B DCMR 2405.2 (e): Where a student is a victim of bullying or harassment, including sexual harassment. It was alleged that and Student A engaged in inappropriate sexual conduct in the staircase at the staircase a

The preliminary investigation included speaking with you and **w**, Assistant Principal at **w**. As a result of this review, we have found that the claim does not warrant further investigation. It is determined that both **w** and Student A willingly engaged in the conduct on March 29, 2019. While the conduct was inappropriate, the allegations do not constitute a Title IX violation because both students willingly participated in the behavior.

However, in order to respond to this incident and ensure that all students are supported, has taken the following action:

1. submitted a work order (work order number:) with the D.C. Department of General Services for a gate to be added in the staircase at
