
RE: Letter of Response for Grievance #3225 filed on May 22, 2019



In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, DC Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:



Investigative Procedure

The investigation included interviews with the following individuals:

- Parent,

 Student A
- Dean of Students,
 Witness #1

The investigation also included review of the following documents which were either submitted by the complainant, submitted by the school, or accessible via DCPS data systems:

General Findings of Fact

The following findings of fact resulted from the investigation:

- reported that that while standing outside of the restroom, Student A began to hit her with a toy microphone. He continued to be playful and started to pull her hair.
- 2. While pulling 's hair, Student A began to
- 3. states that Student A also touched and from the outside of her clothes.
- 4. Student A denied inappropriately touching in a sexual manner or making an attempt to kiss her but did admit to pulling her hair.
- 5. Witness #1 states that she saw Student A pulling 's hair and her while saying .
- 6. Witness #1 recalls Student A grabbing on her waist while he was behind her. was heard saying "stop" and was attempting to push Student A away from her.

Discussion/Conclusion

As a result of this review, we have found that the incident that occurred on May 8, 2019 between and Student A does constitute a violation of Title IX and Chapter 25 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, which governs student discipline. It is more likely than not that Student A aggressively pulled 's hair and inappropriately touched her in a manner that is sexual in nature.

DCPS has taken the following actions below to address this incident:

- 1. On May 8, 2019, Student A received a Chapter 25, Tier 5 infraction as a result of his behavior.
- 2. As a result of this incident, Student A is no longer enrolled at
- 3. Following the incident, met with School Social Worker, on a daily basis to provide her with support and help her with anxiety.
- 4. Dean of Students, performed morning and end of the day check-ins daily to ensure that was comfortable with the educational environment at .

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
