


In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, DC Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced grievance.

#### **Grievance Issues**

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. 5-B DCMR 2405.2(e) Where a student is a victim of bullying or harassment, including sexual harassment.



## **Investigative Procedure**

The investigation included interviews with the following individuals:

# **General Findings of Fact**

The following findings of fact resulted from the investigation:

- 1. and Student A both were a part of which held after-school rehearsals.
- 2. On May 22, 2019, Student A asked to step into the boys dressing room so that the two students could talk.
- 3. Witness #1 was also an occupant in the boys dressing room.
- 4. While in the boys dressing room, Student A was sitting in a chair and reached his hand to touch 's
- 5. then attempted to leave the dressing room and was touched again on her buttocks by Student A.

### **Discussion/Conclusion**

As a result of this review, we have found that the incident that occurred on May 22, 2019 between and Student A does constitute a violation of Title IX and Chapter 25 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, which governs student discipline. Based on the preponderance of the evidence, it is more likely than not that Student A touched without her consent.

DCPS has taken the following actions below to address this incident:

- 1. On May 22, 2019, Student A received a Chapter 25, Tier 3 infraction as a result of his behavior.
- 2. On June 6, 2019, DCPS CARE offered to provide support services to However, you denied services stating that they were not needed at this time. Should you seek any support, please contact DCPS CARE at the number provided below.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
