In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, DC Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

- 1. **24 DCMR Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.2 (f)** Any other violation of a right granted by law that does not have a specific grievance procedure or hearing process provided in this title.
 - a. On a greed to reimburse you for a jacket that was misplaced while was in school.

Investigative Procedure

General Findings of Fact

The following findings of fact resulted from the investigation:

3.	You approached Principal, about this issue. Principal, agreed to reimburse you for the
	jacket by purchasing a new one that was comparable to the jacket . lost.
4.	Principal, agreed to reimburse you for the jacket by purchasing a similar jacket. Principal,
	stated that she would have the jacket by the end of June.

Discussion/Conclusion

24 DCMR Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.2 (f) is substantiated. Principal, agreed to reimburse you for a lost jacket. You did not receive a replacement jacket by the time your grievance was filed.
