RE: Letter of Response for Written Grievance #3305 filed on July 10, 2019



In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its review of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. 5-B DCMR 2405.2 (f): Any other violation of a right granted by law that does not have a specific grievance procedure or hearing process provided in this title. You allege that your student, was stabbed in the eye by another student with a pencil. You took to the emergency room and were given a cream that resulted in a \$1,000 medical bill. You allege you should not be responsible for paying the bill and the family of the other student should assume responsibility.

Review Procedure

Discussion/Conclusion

As a result of this review, DCPS has found the following:

1. DCPS finds that **5-B DCMR 2405.2 (f)** is not substantiated. DCPS lacks the authority to require another parent to provide a reimbursement for your student's medical expenses. Further, on

, you represented to the CARE Team that you believe your medical insurance has paid the bill.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
