RE: Letter of Response for Written Grievance #3349 filed on September 13, 2019

Dear [REDACTED]:

In accordance with Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its preliminary investigation of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. **5-B DCMR 2405.2 (e)**: Where a student is a victim of bullying or harassment, including sexual harassment. It is alleged Student A forced Student [REDACTED] to engage in sexual acts, including kissing and touching. These allegations fall under Federal Title IX Law of the Education Amendment of 1972 ("Title IX"). Title IX prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex which includes sexual harassment and sexual violence.

The preliminary investigation included speaking with the [REDACTED] Social Worker, [REDACTED]; Student [REDACTED], Student B and Student C. DCPS CARE attempted to speak to Student A but was unsuccessful. As a result of this review, we have found that the claim does not warrant further investigation. There is no information to suggest that Student A and Student [REDACTED] have had any physical interaction or any relationship. Student [REDACTED] reported to the CARE Team that she has had no physical contact of a sexual nature with Student A and that there was possibly confusion in the reporting of this incident. Student B and Student C's reports were consistent with the report provided by Student [REDACTED]. Therefore, these allegations do not constitute a Title IX violation.

This matter is considered closed at this time.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
