

RE: Letter of Response for Grievance #3401 filed on October 2, 2019



In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, DC Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced grievance.

## Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

5-B DCMR 2405.2 (f): Any other violation of a right granted by law that does not have a specific grievance procedure or hearing process provided in this title. You reported an ongoing safety concern after Student was shot. Additionally, you reported that you did not receive follow-up from the school regarding options to continue school at home.

### **Review Procedure**

# **General Findings of Fact**

The following findings of fact resulted from this investigation:

- 1. On you reported to DCPS CARE that on Student Student was shot, likely by another student at School.
- 2. You reported to DCPS CARE that Student was shot in his dominant hand and does not have full mobility.
- You reported to DCPS CARE that you completed Home/Hospital Instruction Program (HHIP) forms and received guidance from Student 's doctor that he should receive instruction at home.
- 4. You reported to DCPS CARE that you were unable to schedule another appointment with Student structure student student could attend school and use a scribe.
- 5. **The HALP program** issued a No Service Form which indicated that Student was not eligible to receive instruction through HHIP.
- 6. You reported to DCPS CARE that in addition to concerns regarding Student 's mobility, you were concerned that returning to school would pose a safety risk for Student
- 7. On a such, could not confirm that it was a student at such could not confirm that such coul
- 8. Student 's neighborhood school is **School and Student** needs six credits in order to graduate.

# Discussion/Conclusion

As a result of this review, DCPS has found the following:

DCPS CARE is unable to substantiate **5-B DCMR 2405.2 (f)**. You expressed safety concerns to DCPS CARE regarding Student 's return to service a School after he had been shot. However, as you reported that you did not know who shot Student 's, DCPS CARE is unable to conclude that Student 's safety at service is at risk as we cannot confirm that the shooter was a student. You reported to DCPS CARE that you requested for Student 's to receive instruction at home, but you never received a response. DCPS CARE received a copy of the Home/Hospital Instruction Program's letter that was sent to you in stating that student was ineligible for the HHIP services. As such, DCPS CARE is unable to substantiate **5-B DCMR 2405.2 (f)**.

To address your concerns, DCPS has taken or will take the following action:

- 1. Regarding your concerns for Student **a**'s safety, on **DCPS CARE** made a referral to the Student Placement Office regarding school placement options for Student **b** For additional questions you may contact them at <u>student.placement@k12.dc.gov</u> or 202-393-2004.
- 2. On DCPS CARE sent you the DCPS enrollment packet which outlines how to enroll Student in a DCPS school via email.
- 3. On DCPS CARE connected you with the DCPS Reengagement Support Specialist in order to create a graduation plan and explore school location options for Student

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
