In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, DC Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity team has completed its investigation of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. 24 DCMR Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.2(e): Where a student is a victim of bullying or harassment, including sexual harassment. It was reported that on November 8, 2019, your student was physically assaulted by Student B. You raise concerns that this incident has presented an ongoing safety concern for Student at

General Findings of Fact

	to transfer Student to a new sch	ool.			

Discussion/Conclusion

As a result of this review, DCPS has found the following:

1.	DCPS CARE is unable to substantiate 24 DCMR Subtitle 5-B, Section 24	105.2(e). On November 12				
	2019, Student reported to staff at	hat Student A told him				
	then chased him and pulled him by his backpack. S	Student reported he				
	was able to take off his backpack and jacket and continue running home. While the incident					
	reported was unacceptable and harmful to Student , DCPS does in	not find that there is an				
	ongoing safety concern for Student at this time. DCPS CARE has					
	reports of a similar nature since the reported incident took place. As so	uch, DCPS CARE is unable				
	to substantiate 24 DCMR Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405.2(e) as Student	no longer attends the				
	same school as Student A and there have been no further reports indicating Student A has					
	posed an ongoing threat to Student					

However, in order to support your student and ensure your concerns are addressed, DCPS has taken or will take the following actions:

- 1. Appropriate Chapter 25 disciplinary infractions were administered.
- 2. On November 27, 2019, Student transferred to request.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
