In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, DC Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

- 1. **5-B DCMR 2405.2 (c):** Where it is alleged that any student or group of students is being subjected to an arbitrary or unreasonable regulation, procedure, or standard of conduct.
 - a. It was reported that Registrar denied your request to send your transcript to a college.

Review Procedure

General Findings of Fact

Discussion/Conclusion

As a result of this review, DCPS has found the following:

DCPS CARE finds that **5-B DCMR 2405.2 (c)** is not substantiated. You requested that your transcript be sent to a college. While Registrar **1**, did not send the transcript, **1** Records Clerk at **1** fulfilled your request within three business days.

In order to support you and ensure your concerns are addressed, DCPS has taken the following action:

1. On June 2, 2020 DCPS CARE followed-up with you via email to confirm that your records request was completed.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
