In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations and D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its review of the above referenced written grievance.

## **Grievance Issues**

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

- 1. **5-B DCMR Subtitle 2405.2(e)** where a student is a victim of bullying or harassment, including sexual harassment.

General Findings of Fact	
The following findings of fact resulted from the review:	
1.	On Student A and Student . engaged in a back-and-forth conflict in the virtual classroom setting where Student A told Student to
2.	After the exchange while still in class Student recorded a video of Student A with the caption, the one person I hate, and posted it to a social media site.
3.	Student alleged that Student A created a video of them on the same day and posted it to social media. DCPS Care did not obtain evidence of the alleged video.
4.	does not have a current policy in existence surrounding cellphones and recording during the virtual classroom setting.
Discussion/Conclusion	
As a result of this review, DCPS has found the following:	
1	DCPS finds that <b>5-B DCMR Subtitle 2405.2(e)</b> is not substantiated. The information gathered during the investigation determined that the alleged incident was an isolated occurrence involving Student A and Student As outlined in the DCPS Bullying Point of Contact Training, cyberbullying is the intention of repeated hurtful comments or posts etc., that are intended to harm. Although Student post was hurtful it was not repetitive and does not rise to the level of cyberbullying. Therefore, DCPS CARE finds that the behavior of Student was not pervasive or persistent and was not in violation of 5-B DCMR Subtitle 2405.2 (e).
In order to respond to your concerns and ensure that your student is supported, DCPS and/or has taken or will take the following action(s):	
1.	Student
2.	On all of Student classes were changed so that they would not be in the same cohort as Student A.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal.
