RE: Letter of Response for Grievance #3814 filed on September 29, 2020



In accordance with Chapter 24 Subtitle 5-B, Section 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, DC Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

- 1. **5-B DCMR 2405.2(e)** Where a student is a victim of bullying or harassment, including sexual harassment.
 - a. It was alleged that Student has sexually assaulted multiple students while attending . Specifically, the following was alleged:
 - i. Student coerced Student A into performing oral sex on multiple occasions in November 2019.
 - ii. Student made repeated attempts to get Student C to engage in sexual acts during the 2017-2018 school year and inappropriately touched Student C's buttocks while in school.
 - iii. Student sent an unsolicited nude picture to Student G during the 2017-2018 school year.

These allegations fall under Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972 ("Title IX") which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex.

Investigative Procedure

The investigation included interviews with the following individuals:

- 8. Parent of Student G.

DCPS CARE was not granted permission to interview Student G about the allegations raised in this grievance.


General Findings of Fact

The following findings of fact resulted from the investigation:

1. In September 2020, Student D made an Instagram post stating that Student is a
and that they had received the from Student A to share this
information publicly. Student D went on to say in the social media post about Student
that

2. In an interview, Student explained that they were involved in a romantic/sexual relationship with Student A. Student denies engaging in sexual intercourse but did engage in kissing and oral sex.

3. During the 2019-2020 school year is when Student says that the relationship with Student A became physical. According to Student, Student A gave Student oral sex approximately 2-3 times.
4. Student states that prior to engaging in any sexual act, it was verbally discussed between the two of them. Student says that each time occurred in the unisex bathroom near the campus. According to Student, in the first instance they went into the restroom with the intention of engaging in oral sex.
5. During the second instance, Student says the two students were in the same unisex bathroom on the campus. Student says that while they were kissing, Student A asked if it was okay if Student A gave Student oral sex. Student responded by saying and Student A did the act.
6. Student stated that there was always consent and that there was never a sign that Student A was uncomfortable. Student denied coercing or pressuring Student A to perform oral sex.
7. In an interview with Student A, the student explains that there was a relationship with Student, first in March 2019 and then again in November 2019 when the two students got back together.
8. Student A also stated that starting in November 2019, the two students engaged in kissing and oral sex but not sexual intercourse. However, Student A states that the sexual acts were not consensual.
9. Student A explains that the first instance occurred while outside near the Potomac River. Student A says that Student Student It is just took his penis out and Student It placed his hand on top of Student A's head to begin the oral sex. Student A stated that there had been no prior discussion about engaging in this behavior. According to Student A, they told Student It that they did not want to do it but Student kept saying, Student A says of the experience
10. In the second instance, Student A says they were at a unisex bathroom at Student A says that Student took Student A's phone and went into the bathroom. Student A went on to say that after an hour passed by, Student A went into the bathroom. While in the bathroom, Student was trying to get Student A to perform oral sex.
11. Student A says there was a half-hour spent of saying "no" and eventually Student A took out his penis. Student A says of this instance,

Student explained that during a niversation about being intimate, Student asked Student G, Student G responded that they wanted to see but after receiving a picture of Student spenis, it made Student G uncomfortable. wit pic	DCPS CARE was unable to speak to Student G about this incident but in an interview th the Parent of Student G, it was confirmed that Student G did receive an unsolicited sture of Student 's penis. The Parent of Student G stated that they chose not to report incident.
info	DCPS CARE attempted to complete a follow-up interview with Student to discuss formation that was learned after the initial interview. However, DCPS CARE did not be permission to complete this second interview with Student

	on the information gathered during this investigation, DCPS CARE is unable to ntiate 5-B DCMR 2405.2(e) as it relates to the three separate claims of sexual nduct.
we cor Stu	In regard to the allegation involving Student and Student A, DCPS CARE received to different accounts from both students involved. Student stated that the sexual acts are discussed and agreed upon and that Student A gave consent. Student A denied giving insent and states that the sexual acts were performed after being pressured by Student DCPS CARE was unable to gather sufficient independent evidence to conclude that udent should be found responsible for coercing Student A into performing sex acts on altiple occasions.
dur sex job wh Stu ind	In regard to the allegation involving Student and Student C, DCPS CARE again believed two different versions of events from the students involved. Student C states that ring the 2017-2018 school year, Student would repeatedly ask Student C to perform a acts and that there was a feeling of being manipulated into giving Student a "hand b". It was also alleged that Student would inappropriately touch Student C's buttocks hile at school. Student states that there was consent and does not recall making udent C feel uncomfortable. These issues were not reported at the time and there was no dependent evidence to conclude that Student should be found responsible for the eged behavior.
201	In regard to the allegation that Student sent an unsolicited nude picture to Student Student admitted to sending a picture to Student G of their penis during the 2017-18 school year. However, Student explained that while having an intimate oversation, they thought it would be okay to send a picture of their penis after asking

Student G, and Student G responded affirmatively. It is difficult to be certain that this conversation went the way it was described by Student but DCPS CARE was unable to speak to Student G or collect copies of that specific conversation between the two students.

DCPS has taken the following actions below to address this incident:

1. On September 28, 2020, the incidents were reported to the Metropolitan Police Department for review and investigation.

2. By December 1, 2020, will appoint a social worker to speak with Student about healthy relationships, understanding boundaries, and other topics related to this case.

As the complainant, if you are not satisfied with the outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
