In accordance with Title 5 Education, Subtitle 5-B, Chapter 24, Subsection 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its review of the above-referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

The information provided raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

1. 5-B DCMR Subtitle 2405.1 (d) & (e) where it is alleged that there has been a violation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 which prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color and national origin, and the D.C. Human Rights Act of 1977 which, in part, prohibits discrimination on the basis of race and color. It was reported that Student said to another student during transition at The preliminary review included reviewing the Incident Report Tool received attempting to contact the Parent of The DCPS CARE Team contacted you to interview your student regarding the allegations raised herein. According to Teacher , Student said during transition at second . Despite multiple attempts, DCPS CARE did not obtain consent to interview Student Student was in 3rd grade at the time of these allegations. Based on the lack of information obtained, there is insufficient evidence to conclude that Student ""'s conduct was sufficiently severe, persistent, and pervasive to demonstrate discrimination on the basis of race, color or national origin. Additionally, while the reported language used by Student is inappropriate, the language is not sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive to demonstrate discrimination on the basis of race, color or national origin. This claim does not warrant any further action and is considered closed at this time.

Discussion/Conclusion

Although this matter is closed, DCPS and have taken or will take the following action:

1. In principal held a meeting with Student to educate Student about different cultures and appropriate language.

You have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
