In accordance with Title 5 Education, Subtitle 5-B, Chapter 24, Subsection 2405 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), D.C. Public Schools (DCPS) Comprehensive Alternative Resolution and Equity (CARE) team has completed its investigation of the above referenced written grievance.

Grievance Issues

Based on a review of the information provided, the written grievance raised the following issues under the jurisdiction of this office:

- 1. 5-B DCMR 2405.2(c): Where it is alleged that any student or group of students is being subjected to an arbitrary or unreasonable regulation, procedure, or standard of conduct.
 - a. On December 08, 2021, it was alleged that Student are received a cut above their eye when Behavior Tech at allowed students in the class to slap box while the Behavior Technician acted as the referee.

Conclusion

DCPS has taken the following action as a result of these allegations:

1. A referral was sent to Labor Management Employee Relations (LMER) on December 17, 2021, for the review and investigation of these allegations. Their findings and any disciplinary actions will remain confidential due to employee privacy guidelines.

DCPS will review all available information related to this incident to determine whether employee misconduct has occurred. Although DCPS appreciates your need to know the results of its review, we are unable to share the results of personnel investigations, including any employee disciplinary action that may have been taken, because this information is contained in confidential employee records. Although this matter is closed

- 2. On December 03, 2021, a report was filed with the DC Metropolitan Police Department (MPD).

If you are not satisfied with this outcome, you have the right to file an appeal. Appeals must be submitted in writing and received within 10 calendar days of receipt of this notice.
