Focus on development of historical thinking and analysis skills	Inclusion of civic online reasoning as a key skill	Directly addresses white supremacy
Reduction in number of standards, increase in rigor of standards	Increased LEA and educator autonomy for areas of focus	Directly examines the complex history of racism in the United States and global history


6-8 Course Progression – *2006 Standards* and *2023 Standards* (changes to launch in SY25-26)

New Action Civics Course (8th Grade)


Let's take a second to dig into two driving concepts of the new Action Civics course:

Action Civics Driving Concept 3

This driving concept will engage students in a critical analysis of the role of media and social media in shaping the understanding and narrative of a policy question. Students will understand how to use media to investigate a contemporary issue and how to investigate the reliability of a website or organization. Students will understand how to evaluate coverage, framing and missing viewpoints in traditional news sources.

Action Civics Course Driving Concept 4

Through this driving concept, students will investigate the ways in which governments attempt to balance individual rights with public safety and order. Students should compare the different rights and protections of citizens around the world with the rights and protections provided by the United States government. Students should analyze the reasons for the evolution of rights over time, including the broadening definition of "citizen," and evaluate the reasons different groups have been excluded from constitutional protections over time. Students should also evaluate the rights of District residents.
