Chancellor's Q&A Session:

- Budget Season has arrived!
 - Through a steadfast commitment to equity, excellence in instruction, and educating the whole child, we have invested carefully and thoughtfully in the past, which has meant that we are in a stronger place than other districts.
 - We are still growing enrollment—more and more families are choosing DC Public Schools.
 - We are not closing schools—we continue to be committed to ensuring great schools in every ward.
 - We are still paying our teachers well—DCPS continues to hire and retain the best teachers in the country.
 - We are confident we'll continue our momentum, as we make sure we're thoughtfully stewarding our resources.
 - o Remaining dedicated to the new five-year capital commitment
 - Succeeding academically
 - Connected to schools
 - Prepared for what's next
 - Sunsetting of federal dollars (ESSER)
 - Implementation of multiple union contracts
 - Number of school-based employees increased by 18%, and student enrollment grown just 2%
- FY25 Budget Forecast
 - Schools will see an increase of \$110,811,486, which is approx. 11.8% increase.
 - Despite the increase, increases in costs will result in many schools having a reduction in buying power.
 - Central services will reduce its budget by roughly \$50 million.
- Collaboration between LSAT and Principals
 - Share budget allocation
 - Principals have to submit their budget on Friday the 23rd
 - Discuss impact of new or changing programs
 - Share final submitted budget.
 - Convene LSAT meetings

- Keep conversations confidential
- Respect opinions of others
- By March 1 we ask that the LSAT confirm they were engaged by signing off on the budget engagement
- Q&A
 - O How do you work with schools who do not have the same support staff as other schools?
 - Leaning on school leaders and families who have context of the school communities to know where resources are needed. Maintaining autonomy of schools to choose their priorities. Through the petition process, schools can highlight specific and unique needs and see if funding is available to support.
 - o Are there any supports for devices for scholars who live in larger households?
 - Yes, the challenge is using local dollars to now purchase devices as we no longer have the federal dollars to purchase with. Technology moves swiftly and the need for updated devices is factored in to the increase in cost to support families.
 - Better screening process to decide which work orders are more important than others.
 - Operating budget vs Capital Budget
 - Operating budget for programming needs
 - Capital budget for small projects, like HVAC and repairs
 - Have not finalized capital budget
 - Prioritizing work orders that are related to safety
 - Addressing chronic facility work orders, a more permanent fix instead of a band aid repair
