

Feedback Summary from LSAT Budget Roundtable at Brookland Middle School (January 23, 2020 at 6:00pm)

Overview of LSAT Roundtable at Brookland Middle School

On January 23, 2020, DCPS Leadership hosted a LSAT roundtable to provide information on next steps for the FY21 Budget. LSATs were encouraged to bring three representatives (Principal, a parent and a staff/teacher). LSAT members received information on their individual Comprehensive School Plan (CSP). Additionally, they were provided guiding questions for a working session during the event.

Summary of Feedback from Roundtable at Brookland Middle School

LSAT members shared the following:

- My school's budget allocation last year didn't reflect high enrollment
- At-risk population at the school is very high, please provide additional funds. Why is 60% of atrisk population not enough to receive additional funding?
- More transparency regarding funding for security. Are there ways that DCPS can be more innovative with security?
- Please provide information on how security is funded
- More pressure on when budgets will be released
- Principals concerned about not having enough time to schedule TA sessions and to process budget information
- Why are staff positions listed with decimals?
- Would more robust budget narratives mean bigger shifts?
- Please use the word equity on the documents instead of at-risk

Exit Survey:

A small percentage of LSAT members who attended the roundtable filled out the exit survey. Below are the averages on the exit surveys collected:
