

ESY Speech-Language Pathologist Description

Extended School Year (ESY) Program:

ESY refers to special education and/or related services provided beyond the normal school year for the purpose of providing a free, appropriate public education (FAPE) to a student with a disability in accordance with the child's IEP. ESY is intended to protect students from regressing on key goals of their IEP over the summer and ensure they can benefit from their IEP during the regular school year.

Qualifications:

- Master's degree (M.A./M.S.) in Communication Sciences and Disorders or Speech-Language Pathology
- Eligible for ASHA Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology
- Demonstrated experience at developing positive rapport with youth
- Good administrative and supervisory skills

Responsibilities:

- Provide related services as prescribed by individualized education programs (IEPs)
- Work collaboratively within the classroom setting to implement students' IEPs
- Develop and monitor recommendations for students to teachers
- Ability and skill in written and oral communication
- Basic computer skills
- Ability to work well in a multi-disciplinary team environment
- Performs other related duties as assigned

Schedule:

The ESY program runs from July 5 to July 29, 2011. Related service providers work 5 hours/day from 8:00 AM – 1:00 PM, Monday-Friday. Speech-language pathologists may work a maximum of 25 hours/week.

Related service providers should expect to report for 1 day of training and preparation before the program start date.

Salary & Benefits:

Related service providers are paid an hourly rate of \$34. Benefits are not included.
